
# Tonight's Program

## Fourth Grade Chorus

***Lo Yisa Goy***.....Traditional Folk Song

Lo Yisa Goy is a Hebrew folk song that traces back to the Jewish tradition.. This piece is a canon, or a piece of music in which two or more voices (or instrumental parts) sing or play the same music starting at different times. We have used this song to work on our vowels while singing, and also to practice vocal independence.

"Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" is a song written by Hugh Martin and Ralph Blane and introduced by Judy Garland in the 1944 MGM musical Meet Me in St. Louis. It has been rerecorded countless times by many famous artists including Frank Sinatra.

***Dormi Dormi***.....Arranged by Mary Goetze

Dormi Dormi is an Italian carol that is based on the words of a traditional lullaby for children. This song switches meters, which means the beat of the music changes throughout the song. This has allowed us to work on rhythm, and practice keeping a steady pulse throughout changes.



***Minka***.....Russian Folk Song

Our fun and lively closing number contains the melody line of a popular Russian folk song, with the words of Jingle Bells and Deck the Halls. This song is a partner song, which means the students begin by singing lines of music in unison, and then put them together to form a two-part harmony. We hope you enjoy!
